CHANGE & TRANSFORMATION

Change is an inevitable aspect of life, often leading to growth and adaptation, but can also be a source of resistance and discomfort. The Bible speaks extensively about change and transformation, both personally and spiritually. It emphasizes that individuals should not conform to the world's patterns but be transformed by the renewing of their minds, aligning with God's will. Transformation is often linked to repentance, a shift in heart that leads to altered actions and a new way of living. As we navigate through change, here are some thoughts and Bible verses that we can turn to along the way.

SPIRITUAL TRANSFORMATION:

ROMANS 12:2 2 CORINTHIANS 3:18 GALATIANS 2:20

Transformation is deeply rooted in one's relationship with God, with the Holy Spirit dwelling within and leading to a change of heart and mind.

RENEWAL OF MIND:

ROMANS 12:2 2 CORINTHIANS 10:5 PSALM 1:2 The Bible emphasizes the importance of renewing the mind, aligning it with God's truth and allowing it to be transformed by the Spirit.

LIVING SACRIFICE:

EPHISIANS 5:2 | P1 PETER 2:5

ROMANS 12:1-2 urges believers to offer their bodies as living sacrifices, reflecting a commitment to change and living in accordance with God's will.

NEW CREATION:

2 CORINTHIANS 5:17

The Bible speaks of a new creation in Christ, where the old has passed away and the new has come.

TRUTH & FREEDOM:

JOHN 8:32 speaks of the truth setting one free, suggesting that embracing God's truth can lead to personal transformation and a new way of living.

INWARD RENEWAL:

2 CORINTHIANS 4:16-18 highlights the importance of inward renewal, even as outward circumstances may change.

GOD'S UNCHANGING NATURE:

MALACHI 3:6 | HEBREWS 13:8 | NUMBERS 23:19 While the Bible emphasizes change, it also highlights God's unchanging nature (immutability).

CHANGE IS PROCESS:

ISAIAH 43:18-19 | PHILIPPIANS 3:12-14

The Bible suggests that change is a process, not a one-time event, and often involves pressing forward in faith.

EMBRACING CHANGE:

ISAIAH 43:18-19 | ECCLESIASTES 3:1-2 | 2 CORINTHIANS 4:16 The Bible encourages embracing change as a natural part of life, recognizing that each season of life has its purpose.

GOD'S PROMISE OF NEW BEGINNINGS:

ISAIAH 43:18-19 offers hope and reassurance that God is working to bring forth new beginnings and opportunities.

Change is a constant force shaping our world and requires us to be flexible and embrace new possibilities.

ANTI-RACISM BOOK STUDY TUESDAY | MAY 27 | 67 PM

The book we will be discussing is My Grandmother's Hands by Resmaa Menakem. Here is a brief description from Amazon. In this groundbreaking book, therapist Resmaa Menakem examines the damage caused by racism in America from the perspective of trauma and body-centered psychology.

The body is where our instincts reside and where we fight, flee, or freeze, and it endures the trauma inflicted by the ills that plague society. Menakem argues this destruction will continue until Americans learn to heal the generational anguish of white supremacy, which is deeply embedded in all our bodies. Our collective agony doesn't just affect African Americans. White Americans suffer their own secondary trauma as well. So do blue Americans—our police.

My Grandmother's Hands is a call to action for all of us to recognize that racism is not only about the head, but about the body, and introduces an alternative view of what we can do to grow beyond our entrenched racialized divide.

Paves the way for a new, body-centered understanding of white supremacy —how it is literally in our blood and our nervous system. Offers a step-by-step healing process based on the latest neuroscience and somatic healing methods, in addition to incisive social commentary.

Everyone I have talked to has suggested this is one of the most powerful books they have read. *All are invited to the discussion*.



We continue to offer an opportunity for people to come together to share their struggles with the world we live in. It is not a place for answers, but a place to share and encourage one another as we try to live our Christian commitment in a world that often seems to be very unchristian. We gather to listen with respect and share in vulnerability.
