
There is a temptation to worry about the future, thinking that one can control or change life's seasons through effort or possessions.

THE FIRST LESSON

Ecclesiastes 3:1-15

For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven:

- a time to be born and a time to die;
- a time to plant and a time to pluck up what is planted;
- a time to kill and a time to heal;
- a time to break down and a time to build up;
- a time to weep and a time to laugh;
- a time to mourn and a time to dance;
- a time to throw away stones and a time to gather stones together;
- a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing;
- a time to seek and a time to lose;
- a time to keep and a time to throw away;
- a time to tear and a time to sew;
- a time to keep silent and a time to speak;
- a time to love and a time to hate;
- a time for war and a time for peace.

What gain have the workers from their toil? I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover, he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. - L: The acknowledgment is that lives unfold within God's times and seasons, both joyful and challenging.
- C: God has made everything beautiful in its time, and has put eternity into our hearts.
- L: It is confessed that God's work from beginning to end cannot be fully understood.
- C: However, God is always with us.
- L: Therefore, rejoice and do good in your lifetime, recognizing that even daily blessings are a gift from God.
- C: Gather at this table, remembering the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, who entered brokenness and redeemed our seasons.
- L: As the bread and wine are taken, you are reminded of God's steadfast love that endures forever.
- C: May this communion strengthen faith and inspire living out the seasons with God and one another.
- L: Fear the Lord, knowing that God is sovereign over all, and worship God who sets the times.

C: Amen.

L: Let us rejoice as we hear the words that remind us of God's greatest gift of love. In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread and gave thanks and broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, "Take and eat, this is my body given for you, do this is in remembrance of me."

Again after supper he took the cup and after giving thanks he gave it to them all to drink saying, "This is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE FAMILY MEAL


All who celebrate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are invited to commune today.

All: Amen.


THE SENDING SONG
