July is a month that Americans associate with freedom. This freedom is something for which we are deeply grateful. *But, as children of God, we need to be clear that this freedom is not the same as the freedom we receive in Christ.* The freedom we receive as American's is too easily misused to gain advantages and comfort for ourselves and for our people. *"Our" people is defined in many ways—my family, people the same color as me, rich people, the right people, people who think like me, people who worship like me, Americans—and the list goes on and on.* The freedom we have in America is the freedom to do, think, believe and speak as we want—that is, as long as we do not violate the laws or the powers we say are responsible for our freedom, the government. American freedom is something that has been and we believe must be fought for—or we could lose it.

But Christian freedom is different.

*In John 19 we find the following exchange between Jesus and Pilate:
So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you (set you free) and authority to crucify you?"
Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over me at all unless it had been given you from above."*

World powers cannot give us this freedom, and they cannot take it away. It is a freedom that is not fought for but is the gift of God. And it is a freedom that is not meant for us to exercise for ourselves but for the sake of the world.

Paul in Galatians 5 says: For you were called to freedom, siblings; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become servants to one another.

We are set free from our fears of not having enough, of being oppressed or killed, fears or failure, or any others fear we have. We know that we are always held in God's love and so we are free to be who God calls us to be for the sake of the world.

In John 8 Jesus says: "if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed."

This is freedom that is not dependent on circumstances and can never be taken from us. It is a freedom meant to be offered to all in love and care. Paul argues in Galatians that Christians are freed from all other authorities and that: **the only thing that counts is faith working through love.**



As Christians all other freedom is understood in our freedom in Christ. This month, as we celebrate the freedom we have as Americans, let us understand and use that freedom in light of the freedom we have through the grace of Christ Jesus our Lord.

FROM Paul Bauman, Trust Board Member

Thanks to earnings from the **ENDOWMENT FUND the last two years, the Trust Board continues to have funds available to expand Trinity's ministry.** During two meetings held this year the board approved Endowment Fund requests from Trinity members totaling \$5,300 for three Special Outreach Ministries:

1. Funds supporting a Greater Milwaukee Synod's synodical approved ministry at two state Department of Corrections centers in Kenosha and Milwaukee.
2. Funds supporting some campership and transportation costs for Trinity's week at Pine Lake Crossways Camp.
3. Funds supporting a fall half day weekend workshop dealing with Loss and Grief Experiences in Life at the Blue Lotus Center, east of West Bend. *Interested Trinity members will have first chance to register for this limited attendee event.*

In addition, this fall a final gift of \$3,400 will be made from the Mission of the Larger Church portion of the fund. That gift joins gifts pledged from some of Trinity's members, fulfilling our 3 year commitment to our synod's Equipping the Saints emphasis.

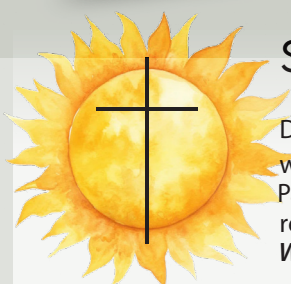
The Trust Board is scheduled to meet again on Tuesday, August 19th and will consider any future requests at that time. However, if a request needs attention before then, the Board can meet virtually to review it. *Request forms are available by the center wall in the Heritage Room.*

The Trust Board held its annual organization meeting in May, when 2025 officers were selected and a 6th voting member, Marcia Vrankin, was welcomed. Trust Board members are appointed by the Congregation Council and each serve 3 year terms. The Trinity Congregation Bylaws also require the Council Secretary, Council Treasurer, and a Pastor to serve as (*non-voting*) Advisory Members. In addition to the Endowment Fund, the Trust Board also has responsibility for the Capital Improvement and Memorial Funds of the congregation.

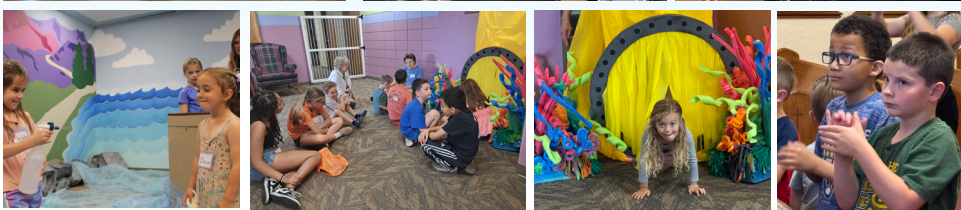



VBS SCUBA | JUNE 9-13, 2025

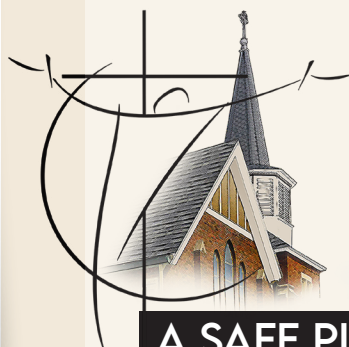

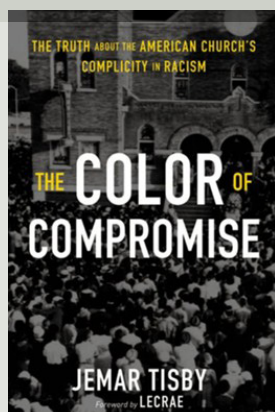
Fleece will be available to pick up beginning Sunday June 29. *We ask that you return the completed blankets by Sunday August 3.*
