Beloved Christian Community,

And wherever we go, whatever we face, we will always be connected by the love of God. A love that is not bound by time, or space, or any human boundary.

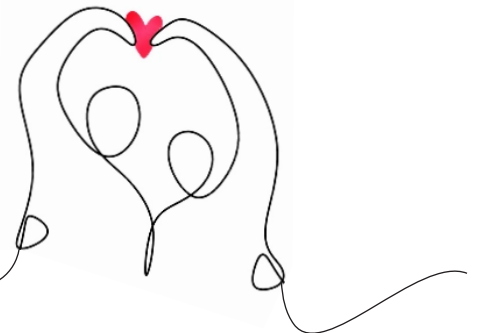

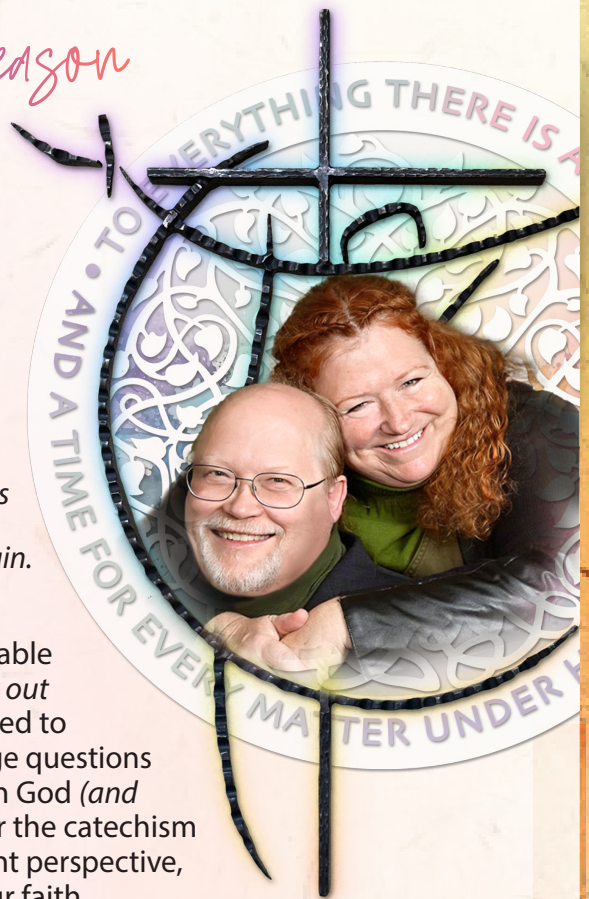

Greetings from your Council President!

I wish to share some updates about our transition, which begins in September after we celebrate Pastors Dave and Cristy's retirement on the weekend of August 30/31. For a brief time, we will have Supply Pastors fill in to lead worship for all services until an Interim Pastor is able to join us. The Council is already working with the Synod to find an Interim Pastor who will be with us throughout our transition time.

We know that many of you have questions concerning Confirmation. We will keep you posted as soon as we have details. The startup date may possibly be delayed, but please know that as a Council and as a Congregation we remain steadfast in our commitment to the spiritual development of our youth moving forward.

After our Interim Pastor begins, and with their assistance, the Council will choose a Ministry Exploration Team, called the MET team. This team of 6-12 individuals will meet weekly or bi-weekly, gathering information about our passions as a congregation, which we will then share with the Synod via a 'Ministry Site Profile'. With this data, the Synod can begin to identify and recruit a Pastor whose values will align, challenge, and lift up our own in our collective spiritual journey as a congregation.

At that point, the Council will assemble a Call Committee of 6 members to interview potential candidates. The Call Committee shall ultimately recommend qualified candidates to the Council for call. If the Council agrees that the candidate seems to be a good match, the next step is to introduce the candidate to the congregation. After meeting a candidate, and on a separate day, we will hold a congregational vote. The congregation will ultimately be the entity to choose our next Pastor as prescribed by Synod rule. If we do not vote in favor, the Call Committee will go back to work and choose another candidate for consideration. We will continue the process until we vote favorably for a candidate who will lead us in the steps of Christ. All of the procedural information is available at milwaukee-synod.org.

Please let me or another Council member know if you are interested in being a part of the MET team or Call Committee. We want the composition of the Committees to be representative of the entire congregation.

Most importantly, please trust that God will be at work with us as we:

- Celebrate our beloved Pastors, Dave and Cristy,
- Welcome and get to know our Interim Pastor,
- Complete our 'Ministry Site Profile' with the information from the MET committee,
- Begin the call process,
- Interview, meet and choose a new Pastor.

This is a process that will obviously take some time. The congregation will be part of the process and updates will be shared as we go. For the last few weeks of August, let us cry, laugh, reminisce, grieve and celebrate with Pastors Dave and Cristy. We hope you can be with us on the weekend of August 30/31. We have a lot to celebrate!

We are grateful to the nearly 100 individuals who took the time to respond to our recent Worship and Music survey. Your feedback was overwhelmingly positive and has been both encouraging and insightful as we look toward the future.

Many of you expressed appreciation for the welcoming and inclusive environment at Trinity. You shared how meaningful it is to be part of a church family that is kind, friendly, and accepting. Respondents highlighted how much they value the opportunity to serve—*both within our church and in the wider community*.

We also heard how much you enjoy the sermons from our pastors and the music at each service. Whether through spoken word or song, it's clear that these elements are making a deep impact.

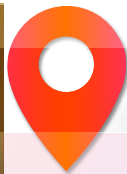

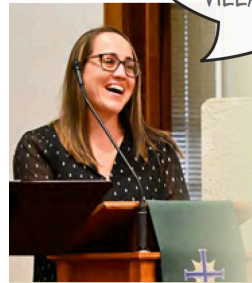

ROTATION LEADERS | Volunteers lead a rotation workshop for three weeks—**ALL LESSONS, MATERIALS ARE PROVIDED**. In Alyssa's absence, Cyndee Bruder has been handing out a kaleidoscope of monarch caterpillar kits! Visit the Heritage Room and the butterfly habitat for updates on kit availability.

WILL TRINITY EXPAND ITS MINISTRY IN AUGUST?

While Trinity has a 2025 Ministry Plan (sometimes called the congregation budget), Trinity has already expanded its ministry this year beyond the budget through its **ENDOWMENT FUND**.

As reported last month, thanks to member requests, three **OUTREACH FUND** requests were approved earlier this year, supporting programs and/or supplies for: Breaking the Chains Ministry (an approved Greater Milwaukee Synod ministry), an October workshop on Loss and Grief Experiences at the Blue Lotus Center (watch for early Trinity member registration in September), and supporting some campership and transportation costs for Trinity's July week at Pine Lake Camp.

In July two more requests were approved, also under the **OUTREACH FUND** parameters:

- a limited campership to a member who was unable to make the Trinity camp week
- monetary sponsorship supporting the Washington County Pride Celebration on August 24, hosted by the Youth and Family Project.

The Trust Board will have its quarterly meeting (now on August 24) and will welcome Trinity member requests that fall under Leadership Development, Outreach Ministry, and/or the Mission of the Larger Church parameters to further expand Trinity's ministry, through its **ENDOWMENT FUND**.

Request forms are on the stub wall in the Heritage Room and can be returned to the Church Office. The Board looks forward to receipt of any requests.

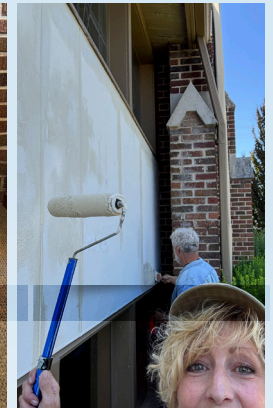
