28 seasons of love Trinity Lutheran to say farewell to beloved pastor duo following 28 years of service

WEST BEND — Pastor Dave and Pastor Cristy Schoob's 28-year tenure with Trinity Lutheran Church in West Bend is nearing its end, as the pair will be retiring following their final service this Sunday.

Pastor Dave and Pastor Cristy's "first" call to Trinity happened in 1997, when they shared one associate pastor position, working with St. Pastor Terry Berg, according to information provided by the church. Pastor Dave worked in Youth and Children's Ministry and Pastor Dave in visitation care, Bible and book studies, anti-racism education and more. Though they have different styles, both of them hold gifts in sharing poignant, down-to-earth and meaningful messages from the pulpit week in and week out.

Under the duo's leadership, the church revitalized its Confirmation program to focus on an understanding and relationship with God and traditional Sunday school was restructured into Children's Ministry Workshop rotations in which kids age 4 up to fifth grade learn the Bible stories in five different, hands-on, sensory ways: SEE it (videos), TELL it (storytelling and acting), MAKE it (crafts), MOVE it (games) and TASTE it (foods). Senior high summer trips also became a tradition. Pastor Dave and Pastor Cristy also developed a First Communion workshop for fifth graders and their parents, which served as an important and meaningful family time shared to prepare them to receive their First Communion. The husband-and-wife pastoral team received their "second" call from the Trinity congregation in

2008 after Pastor Terry's retirement and since then they have served as Trinity's co-senior pastors. Pastor Dave has always had a passion to be the voice for the voiceless, advocate for justice and educating people on sometimes uncomfortable subjects. With his help and guidance, in 2017 Trinity adopted a new Welcome Statement and became Washington County's first Reconciling in Christ congregation. This asserts that the church, as a congregation, will continually strive to live and walk in his way — welcoming people just as they are without distinction.

When asked about their journey, Pastors Dave and Cristy attributed their success and joy to the support they have received not only from their support staff, but their congregation as well.

"The people here are just incredible folks, and to be part of their ministry with them has been a really wonderful journey for us," said Pastor Dave. "The high point of our ministry is probably just to have been here and traveled with them. A lot of people see churches as mostly about the pastor, but it's not, it's about all of us together and the things that we do, and they've just been incredible here so I feel really blessed."

During their conversation with the Daily News, the two placed a large emphasis in the church's mission statement, "Sharing the love and promise of God," and their welcome statement announcing that everyone, from everywhere, is welcome, regardless of the various labels they carry. Pastor Cristy added that over the course of their time with the church, things have changed, evolved and grown and the two expect that growth to continue.

"It's been a tremendously good fit; a work of the spirit that we all kind of have the same vision and together the church has grown in its understanding of who it is and of how we can be God's presence in this community. If it's changed, it's grown, it's developed and we've become an option in this community for those who feel like they don't have one," Cristy said. "Our welcome statement makes us unique in this area for sure, and that came about after a long process of growing. That wasn't something that happened overnight, and it was wonderful to be a part of it."

Looking ahead, Pastor Dave and Pastor Cristy expressed excitement for their newfound free time, offering them the opportunity to explore travel and other hobbies. There will be a Sending Celebration for the two of them following the 9:30 a.m. worship service on Sunday in the Heritage Room at Trinity, and the church wishes them the best in this next chapter.

"Though they will be deeply missed, as they retire, their legacy of acceptance, compassion, wisdom, and grace will continue to inspire the Trinity congregation," the church said in a recent statement. "We know retirement isn't the end of their ministry — it's just a new way of serving. We hope this next season in their life will be filled with the blessings of new joys, fresh purpose, well-deserved rest and peace."

Thank you to all of our co-workers on the staff throughout our whole 28 years. They were integral to all the ministries that happened and they made our time at Trinity a joy each and every day.

Thank you to the parish coordinators, those who communicated with their incredible gifts, those who cared for the church with love, those who helped manage the finances and the work we did every day. Thank you for those who made beautiful, meaningful music and made sure that music was always a central piece of the worship. Thank you to those who made sure the ministry with our children and youth was a top priority.

Thank you to the volunteers who gave themselves tirelessly in so many ways both inside the congregation and outside in the community.

Thank you to those who loved and guided our children and young adults and showed them how the love of God looks rather than just talking about it.






