## BEHIND THE STORIES: *God Speaks*

In the Gospels, God speaks directly only twice. Once at Jesus' baptism and once at his transfiguration. One time God speaks to Jesus, and one time to Peter, James, and John.

After he is baptized, the Holy Spirit descends on Jesus and a voice from heaven (the voice of God) proclaims "**You are my Son**" naming Jesus and giving him an identity. *In Matthew's Gospel the voice seems to speak to everyone present saying "This is my Son."*

This is the Gospel writers' way of letting us know who Jesus is. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is now explicitly stated here. Jesus knows, and we know, who Jesus is. *John does this a little differently in his Gospel. It still occurs after Jesus is baptized, but it is John the Baptist who proclaims the news about Jesus' identity.*

Like the birth narratives in Matthew and Luke, we do not have an absolute historical record of exactly what happened. Did it happen while Jesus was still in the water or later when he was praying (Luke)? Could everyone hear the voice (Matthew), or was it a voice for Jesus only (Mark & Luke)? Or was there no voice (John)? The significance of the story is not in its historical accuracy, but in the message being conveyed by the Gospel writers. We are hearing a proclamation that Jesus is God's Son, that Jesus is beloved of God, and that God is well pleased with Jesus.

The baptism is immediately followed by Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, but I want us to jump to the other direct communication from God, because it is nearly identical.

This time, Jesus is on the mountain with Peter, James, and John, his closest disciples, and he is transfigured (*a strange term which I basically understand as God's glory shining through Jesus, or the disciples seeing Jesus in his divinity.*) He is also seen speaking with Moses and Elijah. And then, the mountain is covered by a cloud and that same voice speaks from the cloud, but this time it speaks not to Jesus, but to the disciples. "**This is my Son, the beloved/chosen.**" And then the voice adds, for the sake of the disciples, for our sake, just in case we are really paying attention: "**Listen to him!**" **A direct command. We are to listen to Jesus, to pay attention to what he says and does.**

Again, the accounts and the words are not exactly the same. We can never get back to the actual historical events of Jesus. We do get back to the proclamation of the Gospel writers. This is what they have to say about Jesus, and what they believe is important for us to know, "*so that,*" as John says, "**you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.**"

In the stories of his baptism and transfiguration, the Gospel writers proclaim to us Jesus' relationship with God and the imperative that we pay attention to him and conform our lives to his.

## HELP EXPAND TRINITY'S MISSION

FEBRUARY ENDOWMENT FUND SUPPORT

The Trust Board's quarterly meeting is scheduled to take place on Sunday, February 22nd, 2026, after the 9:30 Worship service. We would welcome requests for use of Endowment Fund earnings to expand our congregation's work of sharing the love and promise of God beyond our 2026 congregation ministry plan (budget).

Funds can be requested for leadership development, community outreach, or the greater church. Over \$29,000 was earned in 2025 from Endowment Fund moneys invested in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Ministry Growth Fund for equally divided distribution during 2026 in the fund's 3 areas. Request forms can be found at the Endowment Fund display next to the screen dedicated to Kaori on the column in the Heritage Room.

In 2025 approved requests totaled \$21,225 from the three Endowment Fund areas. *The Trust Board looks forward to consideration of any fund requests you present prior to our meeting on February 22nd.*

## HOPE is an action verb.

*Hope, as an action verb, is active choosing rather than passive wishing.*

To hope is to lean forward into possibility—to act as if tomorrow can be shaped by what we do today. It is the decision to keep showing up, even when outcomes are uncertain. Hope listens, waits, prepares, and persists. It gathers strength, imagines a better end, and then takes the next faithful step toward it.

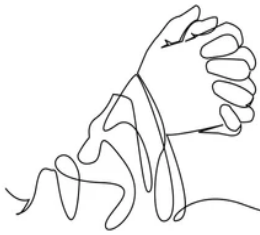
Hope plants seeds it may never see grow, speaks courage into fear, and trusts that effort matters. It is not denial of hardship, but the deliberate refusal to let hardship have the final word.

In this sense, hope is a verb because it moves—it motivates care, inspires resilience, and turns belief into lived practice.

## THE POWER OF *prayer*

The idea that power is inherent in prayer is a very popular one. According to the Bible, the power of prayer is, quite simply, **the power of God—who hears and answers prayer** (in His way and time—not ours!).

*People describe the power of prayer in several ways:*

**CONNECTION:** Prayer is a living relationship with God, a way of listening as much as speaking, and of placing ourselves in God's presence.

**TRANSFORMATION:** Through prayer, fear can become trust, confusion can become clarity, and grief can be met with peace. It shapes our hearts to be more loving, patient, and faithful.

**STRENGTH AND COMFORT:** Prayer sustains people in moments of illness, loss, uncertainty, and joy, offering a sense of being held when answers are not immediate.

**GUIDANCE:** Many experience prayer as a way of discerning direction—finding wisdom not by escaping problems, but by facing them with God.

**HOPE AND TRUST:** Prayer reminds us that we are not alone and that our lives are part of something larger than ourselves.

In short, **the power of prayer** lies in its ability to draw us into deeper trust, align our will with God's, and open us to grace that can quietly but profoundly change lives. Recipients testify to prayer's power bringing peace, healing, guidance, and life transformation—with experiences ranging from miraculous physical recovery to inner peace.

**TRINITY PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY** | Trinity has a small group of ladies who make **prayer shawls**. Each shawl is tagged by the person who prayed over it as they transformed skein of yarn into a shawl to be shared with people they may never know. Prayer shawls are **free** for the taking, intended for anyone who might be comforted by them and the knowledge that they are being held in prayer. Shawls can be found on the "Prayer Wall" The short wall at the end of the fireplace in the the Heritage Room.

*At present, just three special women: Shiril Curreri, Pat Harter and Diane Ferstadt make Trinity's Prayer Shawls. If you knit or crochet and would like to help make prayer shawls, please talk to one of them—or stop in when the Trinity Comforters meet on Thursday afternoons for more information. If you would like to donate yarn—please talk to them to ensure the right type of yarn is donated.*

### TRINITY PRAYER CHAIN MINISTRY

Trinity also has an active **e-mail prayer chain** group that serves as a quiet, but important ministry in the life of our congregation. Often referred to as '**Prayer Warriors**', chain members believe God hears and answers prayer, and they have hearts to praise God and minister by way of lifting prayers for other's needs, concerns, joys and sorrows alike.

To be held up in prayer by other believers in a time of crisis or difficulty is perhaps the most comforting gift we can receive from each other. Prayer requests can be kept confidential and are not limited to Trinity members.

## KEEPING THE PROMISE

**FEBRUARY 8 - MARCH 1** KEEPING THE PROMISE is a special rotation presented within Trinity's Children's Ministry program every year. It is made up of six workshops designed to help each grade level develop a deeper understanding of one aspect of the promise their parents made for them at their baptisms.

**This rotation is designed directly from the baptismal vows:**

*In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring him/her to the services of God's house, and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As he/she grows in years, you should place in his/her hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for his/her instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of their Baptism and in communion with the Church, he/she may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.*

For four weeks each 3 year old– 5th Grader will be exposed to different presentations of the baptismal focus for their grade level.

## LITTLE LAMBS

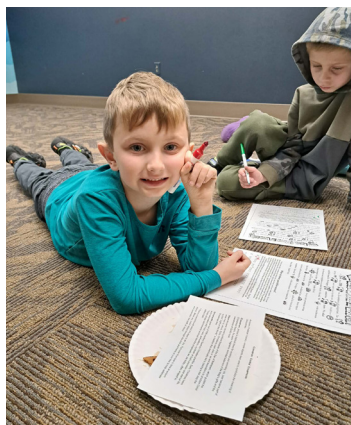

WEDNESDAYS | 5:30 - 6:30 PM

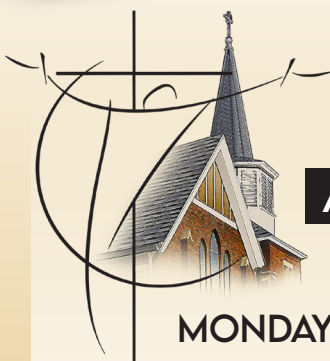
